PROJECT SUMMARY

In early 2022, Fuse Consulting Ltd. was contracted by the Canadian Forest Service's Northern Forestry Centre's Land Reclamation & Ecosystem Restoration Lab to assist them in engaging community outreach about land reclamation. Working with Elder-In-Residence Heather Poitras and Kôhkom Kathy Hamelin, The short film was created exploring different ways people connect with the land through discussions with 3 groups of local Alberta women: Elders, scientists, and farmers. The goal of the video is to showcase different perspectives and support students in their own journeys towards building authentic, positive relationships with the land and their community.

Everyone involved in leading the project - the filmmaker, the producer and the people appearing on the video - were women or identify as two-spirited. There was also a commitment to hire as many Indigenous contractors as possible, including those working in pre- and post-production. The intention behind this project was to go beyond the standard truth and reconciliation protocol, and to build trust and authentic relationships.
